I participated in a study with the Texas Forest Service using Tordon to create a barrier of dead trees on the perimeter of a large disease center by injecting the herbicide in the lower trunks with a hypohatchet. It did not work, presumably because we did not get good root kill, even with a very effective herbicide. The effort was a failure. I have heard similar stories down through the years from ranchers. Are there no alternatives?
